## Guidance development and implementation



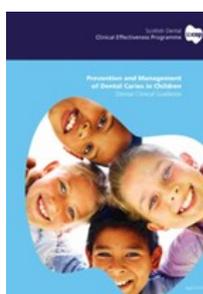
**Oral Health Management of Patients at Risk of Medication-related Osteonecrosis of the Jaw (MRONJ)** will be published and distributed in early April 2017. This is an update to the previous

guidance on patients prescribed bisphosphonates and includes other drugs now linked to MRONJ. Working to the publishing schedule, TRiADS are surveying GDPs, pharmacists and GMPs to inform the development of integrated educational implementation tools for the guidance. A clinical audit linked to the guidance is also being prepared to support its implementation. See under Future Events for details of the MRONJ CPD Event.

the updated guidance will be applicable across the UK. Patient interviews, online consultation, and interviews with sedation practitioners have been completed in support of the implementation of the guidance recommendations.

The current Sedation Practice Inspection (SPI) Checklist will be updated after publication of the Conscious Sedation guidance.

### Prevention and Management of Dental



**Caries in Children** will shortly be made available for consultation/peer review. Timing of the publication will depend on the outcome of the consultation. Clinical audits for fluoride varnish application and

fissure sealant placement have been piloted and will be made available to support guidance implementation.

## Scottish Adult Oral Health Survey

The [Scottish Adult Oral Health Survey: Pilot Project 2016](#) was published by ISD in February 2017. Ninety-two dentists and 1,867 patients participated. The pilot project demonstrated it was possible to gather high quality survey data in relation to patients' oral health and behaviours as part of a routine dental examination.



The long-term aim of the survey is to regularly record levels of adult oral health across Scotland to inform policy, plan services and improve and maintain health. Dentists who participated in the survey were eligible to claim three hours clinical audit credit and 56 dentists fully completed all the requirements of the [audit](#).



## Dental Quality Improvement



As part of the Scottish Patient Safety Programme led by Healthcare Improvement Scotland, the first Dental Quality

Improvement Collaborative ended on 31 March 2017. Fourteen practices in three Health Board areas participated.

From April 2016, using Quality Improvement (QI) methodology, the practice teams made changes and gathered data to evidence improvements related to patients on high risk medication. The feedback from the practices involved has been constructive and positive.

Three members of the QIiPT are currently undertaking a QI Skills course with a view to them supporting practices in the future.

It is hoped that there will be an opportunity to continue this work for another year to allow more dental practices to take part and gain QI skills and experience.

A national event to introduce QI in a dental practice setting, hosted by Health Improvement Scotland and NHS Education for Scotland, is being held on 24 April 2017 at the Stirling Court Hotel, Stirling. The aim is to consider the benefits of improving quality.

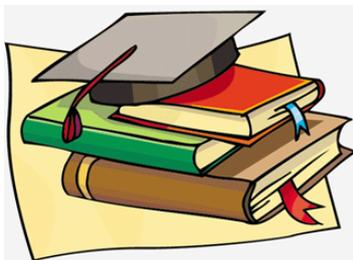

## Scottish Dental PG Fellowships

Four new Scottish Dental Postgraduate Fellowships were awarded in December 2016 to enable four dental healthcare professionals undertake a MSc. in Quality Improvement at the University of Dundee.



The Fellowship opportunity attracted considerable interest from primary care dentists and DCPs. Following a highly competitive selection process two GDS and two PDS dentists began studying for this qualification in January 2017.

## Influencing Patient Lifestyle

### ENGAGE Study

UK dental guidelines recommend that dentists should opportunistically intervene to influence their patients' smoking, alcohol intake and diet, as these lifestyle factors can seriously impact on oral health.



**ENGAGE** is a 6 month, CSO funded study that started on 1 February 2017. A collaboration between the University of Dundee and NES, its aim is to inform the development of appropriate training and support for the pragmatic implementation of these recommendations in Scottish primary dental care.
